

The merit scholarships we offer reflect the beautiful tapestry of the Gifft Hill School community. From donors to longtime GHS supporters and community members to those who touched our lives before leaving this Earth far too soon, these awards recognize the myriad talents and unique traits of our accomplished student body.

These scholarships, funded by our endowment, are just one way we ensure equitable access to a GHS education. In addition to the \$37,232.76 in merit scholarships awarded in 2024, we provided \$1,106,825 in financial aid with the help of our generous donors.

Anderson Family Scholarship

This award was endowed by the Anderson Family Foundation following the hurricanes of 2017, when John and Marion Anderson were moved by the community spirit and perseverance they saw on St. John following Hurricanes Irma and Maria.

Beth Jones Empowerment Scholarship

This award is given in honor of Beth Jones, former GHS Director of Advancement, who worked tirelessly and passionately on behalf of the students of Gifft Hill School.

Beth Knight "A Friend to All" Scholarship

Established in honor of Ms. Beth Knight who served the island of St. John for more than 30 years as a teacher and principal, this award is given yearly to a Lower Campus student who embodies kindness and an enduring commitment to a compassionate community — qualities this award recognizes with its annual disbursement.

Damien Smith-Wallace Spirit of GHS Scholarship

Named for a GHS student who passed away at the age of 15 in 2017, this award honors one student at the elementary, middle, and high school level who demonstrates a passion for learning, dedication and creativity in the arts, commitment to athletics, peer leadership, and model citizenship and commitment to service.

Miles Stair Service Scholarship



ENDOWMENT FOR Faculty Development

In 2022, long-time Gifft Hill School supporters Martha and Dana Robes established the Jane Bancroft Cook Endowment Fund to enhance the salaries of the faculty and staff in recognition of their stalwart commitment to their students and the school. This fund honors



Martha's mother, Jane Bancroft Cook, and her legacy of providing a lifetime of support for education, including helping found New

College in Sarasota, Florida. Mrs. Cook believed deeply in the transformative power of education and understood the disadvantages created when access to quality education is denied. The Robeses hope others will join in supporting this fund which will augment faculty salaries in perpetuity.

In 2024, GHS was able to offer bonuses to faculty with a 4% draw of \$9,689 from the Jane Bancroft Cook Endowment Fund. The draw also paid for professional development courses, putting our teachers on the receiving end of our experiential learning model.




